GCSE Biology trip to Chester Zoo

On 15th October 2019, as part of their GCSE Biology course, year 11 visited Chester Zoo to take part in a conservation genetics workshop: Living with Tigers. Students used genetic fingerprinting to find if the local tiger population was responsible for taking livestock from a village in Nepal.







Bush Craft at Red Hall Farm



Red Hall Farm is a working cattle farm owned by Mr and Mrs Beresford. On their farmland, they have several acres of woodland and three fishing ponds, which they have kindly allowed us to access. While in the woods, Key Stage 3 pupils have been learning how to use tools such as folding saws, bow saws and knives.

The students have used folding saws to trim branches and a knife to whittle pegs and create other helpful equipment. They have been learning how to make shelters from the natural resources around them and how to create and sustain a fire in different ways. In the future, we hope to introduce the preparation and cooking of wild food such as rabbit and pigeon over an open fire. In the coming months when these skills have been honed, there will be the opportunity to fish in one

of the three pools to those willing to put the effort in.



The Allotment

During the autumn term, pupils have been developing the school's new Allotment! The Acres Allotment site in Silverdale has kindly allowed the school to use a plot to grow fruit & vegetables over the coming years.



The aim of the project is to help pupils understand where their food comes from and how to grow and maintain produce.

Allotment gardens often begin in a bit of a mess. Pupils have worked hard to clear away lots of overgrown weeds and rubbish to make space for planting areas. Pupils have so far prepared the soil and built some wooden planters on one half of the garden. They have been successful in planting winter onions and garlic, which will be ready to harvest in June 2020.

Over the remaining weeks, pupils have been putting down weed suppressant and creating paths between planters which have really improved the overall look and feel of the garden.

School Meal Cost Increase
