Catch 22 Stoke-on-Trent and Staffordshire

Catch 22 have released a new flyer giving information around Child Sexual Exploitation, Child Criminal Exploitation & Missing Service during COVID-19.

Due to the current restrictions, Catch 22 one-to-one work is taking place via phone or video call and they are sending out a range of resources and activities for young people and their families, although they will consider face-to-face support where necessary and appropriate.

YMCA North Staffordshire

YMCA North Staffordshire will offer support to the community in the following ways:

The Family Work Team will: Provide support to families requesting help. This support for families may address concerns such as, Domestic Abuse, Parenting, Conflict between family members, managing social isolation, ideas for children of all ages, advice on childcare and strategies for ensuring families can remain under the same roof and can manage their relationships. Catch 22 can support with communication skills, how to resolve conflict and provide advice and support when things get difficult.

Catch 22 are also support community groups with the delivery of essential items and the delivery of family resource and activity packs free of charge to help social isolation.

In addition, the youth services team have created a bespoke online offer via platforms including Zoom, Instagram and Facebook to keep young people aged 10-15 entertained at home.

The Reducing Reoffending Program (RRP)

RRP have updated their Exceptional Delivery Model to reflect ongoing changes to service now that the government have extended the lockdown period.
